-Trash not collected due to a holiday will be picked up the following day (M-F), along with that day's normally scheduled collection. Where two-day holidays occur, trash pickup will take place on the two days following the holiday, along with normally scheduled collection.

-Please place garbage out for collection by 8 a.m.

- Annual Spring Cleanup = first two weeks of April.
- Annual Fall Cleanup = first two weeks of October.
- Fall Leaf Collection = months of November & December, then by request.
